

ik-sang is now 14 years old but he is shorter than his peers. This is typical of someone who has mucopolysaccharidoses (MPS, 黏多醣症). Lik-sang's body is short of a certain type of enzyme, thus causing a lot of health problems, such as stunted body growth. There are only 40 people in Hong Kong who have the same disease, and they probably have a much shorter life.

Because of his condition, Lik-sang can hardly participate in physical activities with his peers. People sometimes look at him in a strange way as




am up in . .

I am Stephen Lik-sang's father. My son is a considerate kid who never grumbles about life. He shares everything with me each night when we have a heart-to-heart chat during bath time. He knows I have given him the best care I can. I know there are curious eyes that peer at him, but I never feel embarrassed holding my son's hand walking across the street.
